General Description



This P-Channel MOSFET is a rugged gate version of ON Semiconductor's advanced PowerTrench process. It has been optimized for power management applications requiring a wide range of gate drive voltage ratings (4.5V – 20V).








Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics.




Figure 2. On-Resistance Variation with Drain Current and Gate Voltage.




Figure 3. On-Resistance Variation with Temperature.




Figure 4. On-Resistance Variation with Gate-to-Source Voltage.




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics.




Figure 6. Body Diode Forward Voltage Variation with Source Current and Temperature.




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics.




Figure 8. Capacitance Characteristics.




Figure 9. Maximum Safe Operating Area.




Figure 10. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation.




Figure 11. Transient Thermal Response Curve.
