




On-Resistance vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Gate Charge






Capacitance




On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature







Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Threshold Voltage



On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Single Pulse Power, Junction-to-Ambient




Safe Operating Area, Junction-to-Ambient




Power, Junction-to-Case


